It was the perfect time for the campaign to end. Supporters were in high spirits at the Foundation's "We Love Bookworms" fundraiser on February 9. The Fair Oaks Library was filled with guests, enjoying food, wine, live music, and cute bookworm decorations. A sense of excitement filled the air as guests waited to learn if the \$200,000 goal would be reached that night.



By evening's end, \$20,000

Redwood City Public Library Earns 5-Star Rating

Highest-rated library of any size in State

Once again RCPL received a five-star rating this year. Ours is the highest rated of all libraries in California, regardless of size. There are only two five-star libraries in the state (Santa Monica is the other one) and just twenty of them in the nation.

Ratings are based on elements including number of items borrowed, number of library visits, numbers of programs and attendance, public computer use and open hours.

Clearly, library services are central to the citizens of Redwood City. Congratulations to the staff who provide the valuable services. Congratulations to the donors who provide the funding for materials and programs.



Popular Story Times Draw ThousandsFoundation funds 19 weekly sessions

People love stories. Both kids and adults love stories. Attendance at a Redwood City Library story time ranges from 20 to 200. Annually, more than 10,000 children and their caretakers come to story times presented at the four Redwood City libraries.

The popularity of these early literacy programs confirms the need to continue them. However, as the library budget is reduced, continued funding becomes more difficult.

In keeping with the Foundation's focus on early literacy, the Board of Directors allocated \$20,000 to keep the story times program running this year. This amount provides a total of 19 weekly sessions. Most sessions are aimed at preschool age groups, but many are open to all ages. Bilingual storytelling is provided in some libraries.

Story times help build fundamental literacy skills. They provide opportunities to introduce kids and parents to high-quality picture books, songs, poetry, finger rhymes and puppets. These experiences help establish a love of reading between a parent and child, build reading skills, and promote the habit of visiting the library on a regular basis.

Foundation Expands Summer Reading Program

Combats student reading loss during vacation

Studies show that students who don't pick up a book over the summer suffer significant "summer reading loss." The gap is especially great with students from low socio-economic families, who lose an average of two months of reading achievement. By the end of fifth grade, these kids are three grades behind their more affluent peers in reading.

The absence of summer school in Redwood City makes this an issue of concern for our community.

In the recent past, the Redwood City Public Library, with support from the Friends of the Library, has run a Summer Reading Club during June and July. Now, with the expectation of donor support, the Library Foundation has pledged to cover the cost of expanding the Reading Club through August.

"The purpose of the Summer Reading Club is to get our youth and families reading, to engage in learning activities and to make frequent use of the library," said Dave Genesy, Library Director.

"The library provides extra copies of great books, schedules weekly story times, family performances and incentives for reading." Last year more than 6,500 adults and children participated.

Teens Benefit from San Jose Museum of Art Program

Eight-week studio arts classes and museum visit

During an eightweek series of classes in early winter, 26 teens learned various art techniques and how to teach art to younger students. Classes, led by an arts educator from the Museum, were held in the library's teen center.



Projects included creating collages using magazine cutouts, robots from recycled materials, and multi-media projects centering on a past experience. Classes also included sketching lessons and printing using different mediums. Building on their classroom experiences, on the last day of class, a gallery teacher led the students on an extensive tour of the Museum.

The project was funded by the Library and a library foundation donor.

The success of the program has encouraged the funders to support another art session this summer. Plans include creating teen advisory groups to assist with planning and implementing the projects.
